

WHY I AM A ROTARIAN

If you are a person interested in simply serving your community, there are many, many opportunities for service here in Santa Fe. The opportunity to give service to the community through Rotary is unique to most other community service opportunities that are available, however. That is the reason I chose Rotary. First of all, each Rotary Club gets to decide for itself what projects it will undertake to help the community. We can tailor our projects to suit the interests of our members and the resources we have available to us, rather than to have those projects dictated solely by the needs and missions of a non-profit, as is often the situation when volunteering to work with many Santa Fe organizations. More importantly, if a project directed at the needs and missions of a non-profit appeals to our Club, we are certainly free to help with it. But there are other, different opportunities available to us as well. The service we give under the Rotary International flag, as one of the world's largest service organization, lets us do good work in not only our community, but on the higher level of district, national and international service. Where else can you find such diverse and numerous opportunities to help others in a single setting?

The special friendships made through Rotary is the other reason I am a Rotarian. The bonds of friendship created while working, sharing and caring are strong. In 1987 I became one of the first women Rotarians in Denver, a charter member of a newly formed Club and its first Community Service Director. Over the past 16 years since leaving Denver, I have maintained my contacts at my old Club and still count many of the members there as some of my dearest friends. Those same bonds of friendship have been repeated twice here in Santa Fe, first with the Downtown Club where I was originally a member and then here at Centro. As I am thinking about retiring and moving away from Santa Fe, it is a wonderful feeling to know that I will take these friendships with me. So what is it that makes Rotarians such great friends? I am not sure I know the answer to that, I simply consider myself lucky to be a Rotarian and have the opportunity for such friendships to develop.

You never know where a Rotary member may turn up. When Rhonda Williams attended the fundraiser for the Vista Grande Public Library in Eldorado on August 27, she caught






