#### President's Message

February is "World Understanding Month" in Rotary International. A Rotarian from San Diego, CA, was recently spotlighted in an NBC Nightly News segment on its "Making a Difference" series. Fary Moini, Iranian born, became a U.S. citizen 20 years ago. Moini had made several trips to Afghanistan and Pakistan as a Rotary volunteer and was struck by the illiteracy and neglect inside Afghan refugee camps located in Pakistan. Together with other volunteers in her club, she raised \$250,000 to build a school in Jalalabad, Afghanistan, to accommodate 2,000 students, many of whom were denied educational opportunities under the Taliban. She is known as "Mama Fairy" to the students and her story is a shining example of how Rotary International promotes world understanding and peace.

On the domestic front, PETS training for incoming club officers is scheduled for March 8-10 in Albuquerque at the beautiful new Embassy Suites. provides a valuable opportunity to learn more about the world of Rotary, to understand club officer roles and responsibilities, to greet old Rotary friends and to make new Rotary friends. The water well was successfully completed several weeks ago and they now have fresh water in La Gonave. George Solomon, who presented the award, is the immediate past president of the Riverhead Club and is the incoming District Governor of district 7260.
